Criteria for Submitting Woven and Non-woven Items

Please remember that it is essential to produce original work. Copying entire designs of any source without any changes is **not** acceptable.

Policy for Woven Items

1. **Handwoven** items with yarn are most preferred.
2. Other acceptable **handwoven** items, for example, can be made with:
 - a. Metal, such as jewelry
 - b. Paper/Cellulose/Plastic, such as baskets
3. Displayed products need to contain at least 50% Handwoven parts
 - a. The dolls, for example, wear handwoven clothing
 - b. Clothing may contain non-handwoven fabric in what is visible

Policy for Non-woven Items

1. If you submit handwoven pieces, you may also submit non-woven items made out of fiber. At least 50% of the items submitted must be handwoven. For example, if you submit 5 woven scarves, you could submit 5 felted bags.
2. Handwovens have priority for display. Quantities of non-woven items will be determined by the space available.
3. We will be looking for the same high standards as in handwovens. There should be no errors in an item, and kits and workshop items are not appropriate.
4. In case of disagreement about an item, ***the Sale Chair will make the final decision.***

An individual member may submit items in the following quantities:

50% Woven

50% Non-Woven

Woven items with yarn are preferred

Any material can be used as long as the finished item is woven

Items that contain non-woven elements need to have at least a 50% content of woven parts

Non-woven items need to be made out of **Fiber!**

Some non-fiber, but weaving related items are acceptable (such as handmade shuttles.)

Example:

1 scarf
1 shawl
1 hand towel
1 rug
1 woven silver bracelet
1 woven wicker basket

1 felted bag
1 knitted shawl
1 pair of knitted socks
1 felted ball
1 embroidered wall hanging
1 sewn lace scarf
